This initiative is double aimed. It wants to encourage both the exchanges between scholars and the developments either of the main or more innovative research fields or of the methodological developments in the actual hagiographical studies.

In order to enhance the discussion among the *panelists* and to provide a common base to the proposals advanced, this Fourth Edition of the *Hagiography Workshops* will be dedicated to the issue “Communicating Sanctity”, a set of investigations pursued in a diachronic and multidisciplinary perspective. The specific purpose is to examine tools, paths, interactions which have been associated with the communicative processes of the sanctity over the centuries.

A thematic seminar project is to be presented and organized by a tutor and composed of three to five communications; a panel discussant will be indicated by the AISSCA Executive Committee. Each panel duration is not to exceed two hours (whatever the number of speakers) included the appropriate time for the discussion..

The panel proposals are to be sent within October 15, 2019 and addressed on line to aisscaweb@gmail.com.

The papers of the panel accepted may be delivered either in Italian or in English, French, and Spanish.

Each panel proposal is to indicate:

1. the tutor (who proposes the panel and will keep in contact with the organizers): name, surname, qualifications, affiliations, home address, mail address, telephone.

2. the title and the abstract of the panel (not exceeding 1000 characters) explaining the issue, the approach and the bibliographic references.

3. the panelists list (from 3 to 5) with their qualifications, affiliations, home address, mail address, telephone, paper title and abstract (not exceeding 300 characters).

The AISSCA Board will evaluate the proposals received on the basis of their originality, academic relevance, homogeneity with the issue and capacity to confront with the national and international historiographical debate.

The list of the proposals accepted will be communicated by October 30 2019 and published on the AISSCA website (www.aisscaweb.it).
