## **AISSCA - *Hagiography Workshops*, 5th edition Rome, January 27-28, 2022**

The *Hagiography Workshops* aim both at encouraging scientific exchange among scholars and at developing new research fields and methodological perspectives with reference to contemporary hagiographical studies.

They represent a “container” for investigations pursued in diachronic perspective and in a multidisciplinary way. The specific purpose is to examine methodological tools, historical-social and historical-religious paths, human interactions between human and super-human agents, which, over the centuries and up to the present day, have been associated with the processes of recognition of the sanctity, the cultic practices, the places of devotion and the forms of hagiographic communication.

### **Each panel should:**

- be presented and directed by a panel-chair;
- involve three to four panelists;
- be scheduled within two hours, notwithstanding the number of participants;
- include a sufficient time for discussion.

### **Each proposal should provide the following information:**

1. Name, contact details and academic qualifications of the panel-chair.
2. Title and abstract of the panel (max. 250 words), along with a list of bibliographic references.
3. Name, contacts and academic qualifications of each panelist, along with the title and the abstract (max. 250 words) of each paper, with a short list of bibliographic references.

English, French, and Spanish languages are welcome.

Panel proposals should be submitted by October 20, 2021 (aisscaweb@gmail.com).

The AISSCA Steering Committee will evaluate the proposals taking into account their originality, their scientific solidity, the coherence of the papers within the panel and potential impact upon national and international hagiographical scientific context.

A list of the accepted proposals will be published on the AISSCA website ([www.aisscaweb.it](http://www.aisscaweb.it)), as well as communicated to the panel-chairs, by October 30, 2021.

The Hagiography Workshops will take place at the Sapienza-University of Rome (Room Chabod, Dep. SARAS).
